

Navigating Campus



- Directions to park on campus: You can park at the Reitz Union which charges \$2 for 45 minutes and \$6 for all day parking.
- If the Reitz Union parking is full, you can park in Parking Garage V which is next to the Commuter Parking Lot. It is a 5-minute walk to the Reitz Union.
- Note: There are several road closures on campus.
- The speed limit on campus is 20mph.

Buses at UF

REGIONAL TRANSIT SYSTEM (RTS)

RTS provides public transportation covering most of Gainesville with frequent stops on bus routes throughout campus. For route information, please visit <u>www.go-rts.com</u>. A real-time GPS locator for buses is also available at ufl.transloc.com.
